## **Singha Lager (Thailand)**

**Beer - Imported \$17.99 (6 Bottles)**

Singha is available in 40 countries worldwide. Singha, a mythical lion, is a sign of strength and grandness. Beginning in 1933, Singha is the first Thai-brewed beer. It pairs well with spicy food.

Brewing **beer in Thailand** began in 1933 with the granting of a brewing license to 57-year-old Phya Bhirom Bhakdi, or "Boon Rawd" Sreshthaputra.<sup>[1]</sup> His company, [Boon Rawd Brewery](#) would produce Thailand's oldest and best-known lager, Singha (pronounced "sing"). Singha is sold in Thailand in standard (5% ABV), light (3.5% ABV), and draught versions.<sup>[2]</sup>

## **2012 Dr. Heinz Wagner Ockfener Bockstein Riesling Kabinett (Mosel- Saar-Ruwer, Germany)**

**Wine - White \$24.99 (750mL)**

From the excellent 2012 vintage, this is an icy cool white characterized by freshness yet offset by the vanilla and creamy texture. This laserlike Riesling then builds nicely on the palate to a long mineral and apple-like finish. Great with turkey dinner. Needs time to unwind. Best from 2012 through 2020.

## **2012 Zind-Humbrecht Gewurztraminer Calcaire (Alsace, France)**

Wine - White \$59.99 (750mL)

Poised and elegant, this has refined acidity deftly meshed with flavors of ripe green melon, papaya, grapefruit granita, Thai basil, white peach and lychee. A spicy, mineral-tinged undertow builds on the finish. Drink now through 2023. 120 cases imported.

## **2013 Gehringer Brothers Signature Series Riesling Icewine (BC - Okanagan, Canada)**

Wine - Dessert \$57.99 (375mL)

Beautiful, silky bodied with searing sweetness. Oozing honey notes with apple sauce, lemon paired with fine acidity. This could age short-term. Pair with B.C grown apple pie a la mode.
