Vignoble Damp't Excellence ,Petit Chablis

The heart of Damp't's wine production is of course Chablis at all four quality levels. They make the most of the range of soils in the region – Kimmeridgian for Chablis itself, hill top sites of harder Portlandian for Petit Chablis and Oxfordian limestone, like the Côte de Beaune, for more rounded Chardonnay and Pinot. The vineyards basically follow the lines of the rivers – the climate here is continental, with cold winters and hot summers, so the moderating effects of bodies of water and air movement is important. Greg Norman Cabernet Merlot

Like the golfer/owner himself, Greg Norman is a large and well-respected producer from Australia, and it earns its reputation with this offering. **Cabernet Sauvignon** and **Merlot** are two of the world's most famous and most widely grown wine grapes. The pair form the foundation of many of the great wines of [Bordeaux](#), where this classic blend (often dubbed "Bordeaux Blend"). The **Limestone Coast** is located in the south-eastern corner of Australia. It is one of the most significant wine zones of the country, producing nearly one-third of South Australia's quality wines – some of which are the most highly acclaimed in Australia. The zone is regarded as geologically unique and the feature responsible for producing such high-quality wines is its soil. As the name suggests, limestone forms the basis of the soil here, best represented by the famous 'terra rossa'. Loads of fruit here, with some sweet spice and a distinct aroma that one blind taster labeled as varnish.

Cabernet-Sauvignon de Purcari

The inhabitants of these lands have known the taste of good wine since history can remember. In ancient times a Roman colony was established here. The Romans had an immense influence on the traditions of local winemaking and consumption.

During the centuries, these traditions not only developed but also improved a lot. Our country became the home of splendid wines.

The glorious moments of our history:

After Bessarabia was joined to Russia, by a decree of the local authorities, issued in 1827, in Purcari was created the first specialized winemaking company. As early as 1847, during an agricultural exhibition held in Bessarabia, Purcari wines were exhibited for the first time and tasters were impressed by its delicate bouquet and dense, full taste. Negru de Purcari, was gained its first gold medal.

The Triumph of Negru de Purcari. In 1878, the Purcari winemakers brought their wines to the Paris World Exhibition. During the closed-doors tasting session, the majority of the jury gave preference to a dry, densely-colored red wine – they were sure it was a new wine from the famous Bordeaux region. They were surprised to learn that the drink came from a tiny, unknown village called Purcari, situated on the Nistru River. Negru de Purcari earned the highest form of recognition on the international arena by being awarded the Gold Medal at Paris World Exhibition.

Purcari (30 km from the Black Sea next to the River Nistru/Dniester). Cabernet-Sauvignon is an estate red wine, aged in oak barrels and finished in glass. It exhibits aromas of peppermint and wild berry as well as a velvety texture with lovely spicy notes and vanilla, contributing to a long-lingering finish.

Marcarini Moscato d'Asti

Made from Moscato Bianco from a century old property at Sergentin in the commune of Neviglie. Low in alcohol (5.5%) with the varieties natural sweetness retained, the wine foams when poured to remain frizzante on the palate with a refreshing grapey finish. This delightful white DOCG dessert wine is the most recent addition to the Marcarini range, from a separate property in Neviglie, heart of the Moscato area. Careful vineyard management and superlative vinification are conducive to a splendid version of this most unusual varietal: soft straw yellow in color, characteristic, fragrant bouquet, delicately sweet on the palate, fizzy, fruity and intense, the perfect dessert wine to end your meal on a joyful note. Best enjoyed in all the fruity, aromatic fragrance and freshness of young Moscato.
